8. I've chosen to investigate the weight of my family. Mum weighs 66.7kg, my brother weighs 71.8kg, I weigh 45.1kg and Dad weighs 85.6kg. What is the difference in weight between the heaviest and lightest person?
9. I buy a £10 phone card. I already have £3.40 credit on my phone. I make a call costing £2.80, how much credit do I have now?

How many days will it take her to cover a distance of 203km to Misty Cove?

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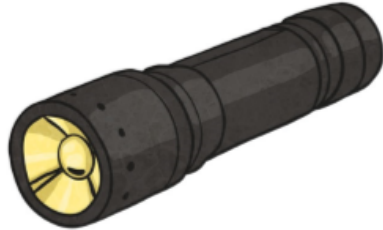

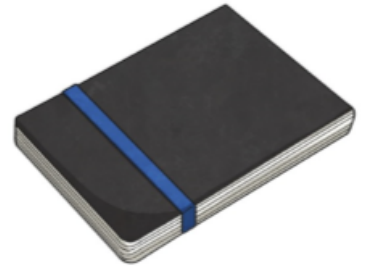
