Attendance Matters

Thank you for your support with attendance and punctuality. A polite reminder that school starts at 8:50am in the morning.

Currently our overall attendance stands at 96.9% which we are thrilled with.

We have 153 (68.3%) children on Green for 96% and above attendance.

51 (22.8%) children on Amber for attendance between 92% and 96%.

20 (8.9%) children on Red for less than 92% attendance.

Mrs Power comes into school every Wednesday morning to help support any parents who are having difficulty getting their child to school regularly or on time.

Loving Learning

At Marsh Green we try to make fun as exciting and interesting as possible. We now devote Fridays to cross-curricular topic work. Children still undertake Maths and Literacy tasks but teachers have the freedom to explore topics in much greater detail. So far this term children have built French buildings, created Celtic villages, explored their local area, been evacuated as part of a World War II topic and found out about countries around the world.
