Subject area	Activities
Speaking,	1. Write a character description about an endangered animal of your choice. Use expanded noun
Listening and Writing	phrases to add detailed description.
	2. Research the World Wildlife Foundation (WWF)
	Create a poster encouraging people to look after the environment and animal conservation.
	3. Create your own poem inspired by The Laws of the Jungle by Rudyard Kipling
	4. Write a letter to Mrs Leigh explaining how we can make our school eco-friendlier.
	5. Listen to sounds from the Amazon Rainforest, list the animals you think you can hear.
Problems, Science and	1. Times tables – collect a booklet, to work on a certain times table, from your class teacher.
Maths	2. Design and carry out an experiment involving the three States of Matter.
	3. Build your own animal habitat in your garden (E.g. a bug hotel or a hibernation spot for hedgehogs)
Art and Design	Take a sketchbook or some paper and draw or paint a local scene by the park, town centre or stadium.
	2. Research your favourite animal and create a mixed media art piece. (Extra points if you use recycled materials!!!)

	4. Design a new medal or trophy for the next Olympic games.
